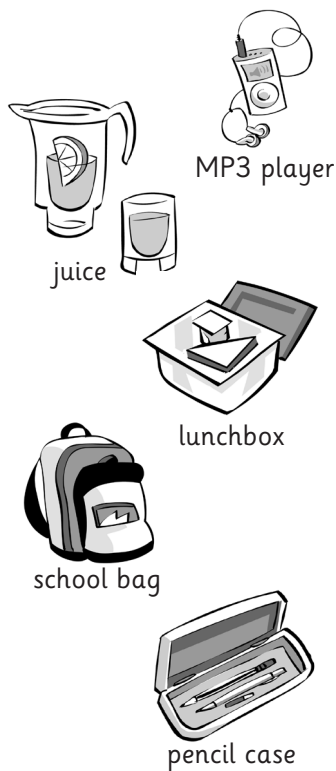

HARRY: Thank you! And I haven't got my **mobile**.

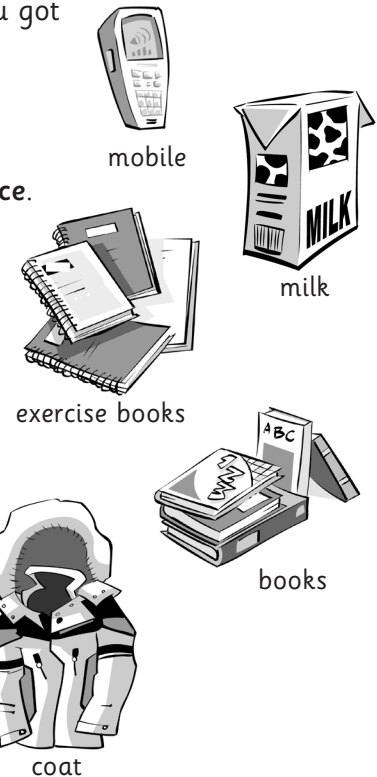
MUM: It's in your bag!
