Marie Curie was born on 7th November 1867 in Warsaw, Poland. Her parents were both teachers and Marie was a good student who worked hard at school. Marie wanted to study at university, but this was impossible in Poland in the 1800s. University was for men, not for women.

Sorbonne University in Paris allowed women to study there. It took a long time but finally Marie went to France and studied at Sorbonne University. After three years of hard work she received her degree in physics.

Marie married Pierre Curie who was also a scientist. Together they discovered two new materials called polonium and radium. Marie also did a lot of important research into cancer.

In 1903, Marie and Pierre won the Nobel Prize in Physics. Marie was the first woman to win this prize. In 1911 she won the Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Marie Curie opened the Curie Institute in Paris, which is still an important cancer research centre today. Marie Curie died on July 4th 1934.
