We use *can* and *could* to refer to present and past ability. We use *to be able to* for all other tenses.


- ✓ Liz can play tennis very well.

#### We never use can + infinitive with to.

- ✓ Jenny can speak five different languages.
- X Jenny can to speak five different languages.

#### Can is not an infinitive.

- ✓ I will **be able to** go tomorrow.
- X I will can go tomorrow.

- **X** Be careful! You must concentrate in what you're doing.

We use *in* after the verbs *believe*, *specialise* and *succeed*.

- ✓ He's planning to specialise in ICT.
- X He's planning to specialise on ICT.

We use of after the verbs consist, die and think.

- ✓ The recipe consists of butter, sugar, cream and flour.
- X The recipe consists in butter, sugar, cream and flour.
