

1 Follow the prompts and write the dialogue in your notebook. Then act it out in pairs.

- A: Asks for a hotel room for three people.
 B: Is sorry, but A won't find a hotel in Granada at the moment. Too many tourists, hotels all full.
 A: Is worried. They intend to visit the Alhambra tomorrow.
 B: Says they'll have to find a hotel outside Granada. Suggests staying in a cave in Guadix.
 A: Asks if B is joking. They can't sleep in a cave.
 B: Says the caves in Guadix aren't primitive. They / find everything / need. Some of them / very luxurious.
 A: Asks if the caves have electricity and hot water.
 B: Confirms. Some even have / broadband connection / swimming pool, and B / not be / too hot / night because the temperatures inside are perfect.
 A: Asks if it is quiet there.
