

### 1 A and B are talking about mirroring. Follow the prompts to write the dialogue.

- A: Ask B why it's good to be on the same wavelength as someone.  
B: Answer. Ask A if he/she is on the same wavelength as many people in his/her life.  
A: Give details. Ask A to explain what mirroring is.  
B: Give details with examples.  
A: Ask B to explain why mirroring might be useful.  
B: Give answer.  
A: Express concern that the person you're mirroring might think you're making fun of them.  
B: Offer a solution. Talk also about mirroring how people speak.  
A: Ask B to explain how that might be useful.  
B: Explain.  
End the dialogue in a suitable way.

### 2 A and B are talking about gestures. Follow the prompts to write the dialogue.

- A: Ask B when he/she yawns.  
B: Give details.  
A: Ask B if he/she thinks it's rude to yawn.  
B: Give details. Ask A why he/she would cough.  
A: Give details. Talk about coughing unintentionally and intentionally.  
B: Ask A why a person might fiddle with his/her hair.  
A: Give details. Say if you think it's something done more by women or men.  
B: Answer. Ask A what gestures a person might use when thinking hard.  
A: Give details. Ask B why a person might tilt his/her head.  
B: Give details. Ask A when a person might stroke his/her chin.  
A: Give details.

### 3 A and B are practising hedging and boosting. Follow the prompts to write the dialogue.

- A: Say cautiously that mirroring works.  
B: Reply assertively that mirroring helps people establish rapport.  
A: Say assertively that infants learn from imitating others.  
B: Reply cautiously that mirror neurons also play an important role in the emotional processes of adults.  
A: Say cautiously that scientists often conduct unnecessary tests on animals.  
B: Say assertively that animal testing is necessary for the good of mankind.  
A: Say assertively that animals suffer.  
B: Say cautiously that animal testing is used less in the production of cosmetics than before.  
A: Say cautiously that animal testing should be banned completely.  
B: Say assertively that animal testing is a complex issue.

### 4 A and B are talking about how we treat animals. Follow the prompts to write the dialogue.

- A: Ask B if he/she could be a vegetarian.  
B: Answer and give reasons.  
A: Ask B what he/she thinks of the ethical argument for being a vegetarian.  
B: Answer and give reasons. Ask A what he/she thinks of zoos.  
A: Express an opinion.  
B: Agree/disagree giving reasons. Ask B if he/she thinks it's acceptable to keep a dog in a flat.  
A: Express an opinion. Ask B what he/she thinks of conducting scientific tests on animals.  
B: Express an opinion giving reasons. Ask B if he/she thinks animal testing is ever justified.  
A: Express an opinion giving reasons. Ask B if he/she thinks that human beings are more important than animals.  
B: Express an opinion.  
End the dialogue in a suitable way.
