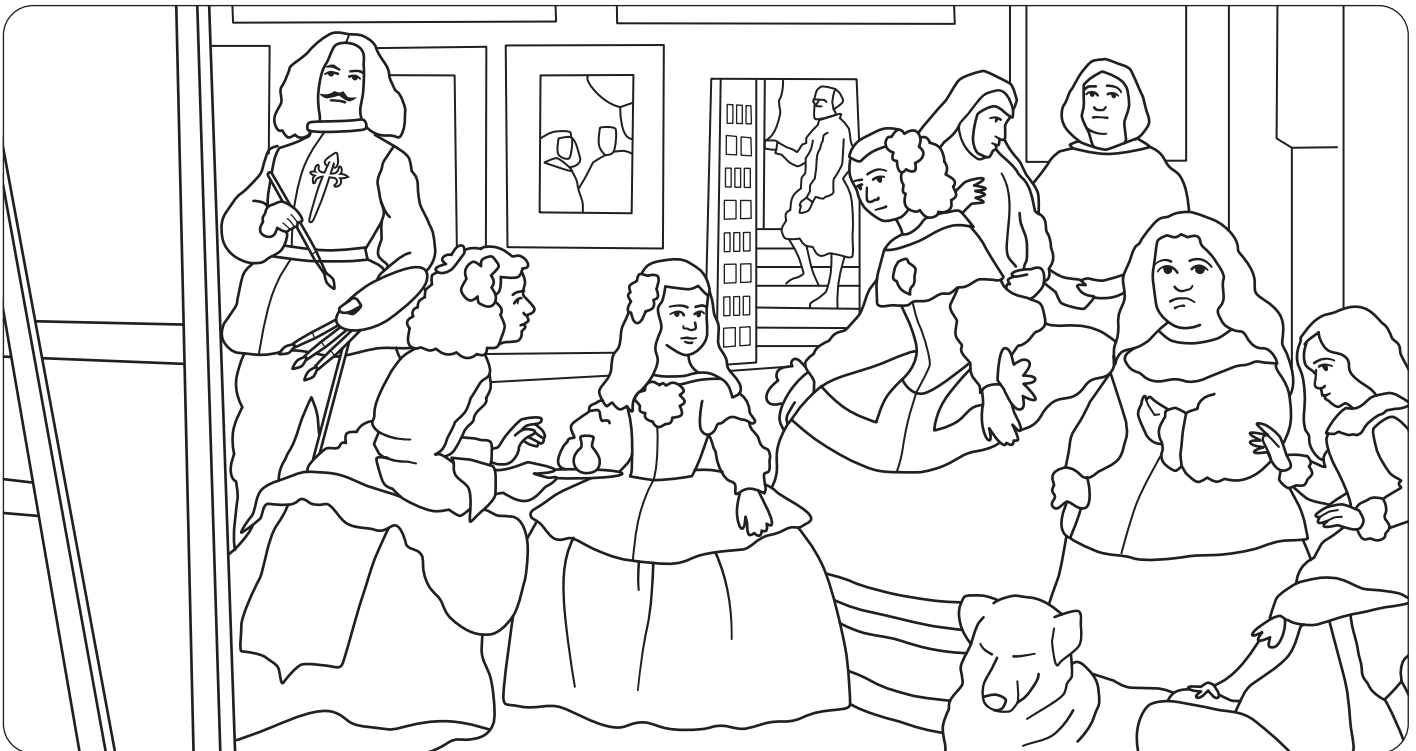


Self-portrait of Diego Velázquez
