SPEAKERS

ANDREA TOLVE is currently Head of Teacher Training Iberia for Cambridge University Press and has been working in the ELT world since 1999. She's taught in Croatia and Spain. Andrea was a teacher and account manager at International House Madrid and followed this by becoming a Director of Studies at her own school. She has a Master of Arts in Education specialising in Applied Linguistics with the Open University.

MARK MEREDITH began teaching English in Spain in 2010. He holds a Trinity DipTesor and is currently working as a Teacher Trainer for Cambridge University Press. Since arriving in Spain he has taught primary and secondary students, future university students on pre-sessional courses and has run a

variety of professional English courses for adults. Apart from this he also set up his own language tuition centre, taught in private academies and worked online as a coach for Rosetta Stone.

TOM WOGAN moved to Spain in 1993 and has remained here ever since. He is now a consultant for Cambridge Assessment English and is also a teacher at the EIM (Escola d'Idiomes Moderns) at the UB, where he specializes in exam preparation courses. Prior to working for Cambridge, Tom worked for a major publisher as a commercial representative and as a teacher trainer.
