Both event sessions highlight the importance of dealing with emotions in the classroom and of promoting a positive CAN do attitude when it comes to exams.

Emotions in the classroom

It is fundamental that teachers help learners understand how and why emotions happen and can manage them effectively. Andrea Tolve and Alex Purcell will begin the event by exploring emotions as a key life skill and discussing the implications for the English language classroom. They will also suggest planning and teaching techniques and strategies.

Can do NOT Can't do

Exams and assessment are often seen as the 'big bad wolves' of the learning process. However, our qualifications are designed carefully in line with the CEFR, and the 'Can-do' statements that make up each level. George Heritage will continue by looking at how recognising and focusing on what students 'Can-do' rather than what they can't (yet!) can inform planning, evaluation of materials and classroom activities.
